Welcome & Introduction - Neil Howell

Review of Year's Activities – Jean Gitsham – Key Points

- 1. See report for full details
- A higher proportion of time is now being spent on routine maintenance. This has been exacerbated by delay in the annual meadow cuts and reduced grass cutting of paths by TDC
- 3. Search for new volunteers continues
- 4. The lodge archway remains blocked
- 5. Community activities have included tours of the cemetery by local groups, visit of Teignmouth primary school as part of local history studies, presentations to local groups, the "Big Help-Out" event. And of course our Facebook site continues to be the main conduit for informing the community about what is going on.
- 6. Big effort to clear sections HH and II
- 7. Start of effort to get details of all graves onto the international "Find-a-Grave" website with links through to our own web-site a long-term project.
- 8. The operational report was accepted, with thanks to Jean for her total commitment throughout the year to all aspects of our operational activities.

Treasurer's Report – Kay Large – Key Points

- 2. Total income £1,238 We're most grateful for this level of income, particularly from membership and donations which allows us some freedom in the way we carry out our work in the Cemetery
- 3. Total expenditure £1,719 this resulted in a loss of £481 which we were fortunate to be able to cover from reserves but the financial situation obviously needs careful watching.
- 4. Unrestricted reserves are now at £1,135
- 5. The financial report was accepted, with thanks to Kay for her keen watch over our accounts for the year

Matters Arising -

- 1. Financial agreed to confirm that a £500 fund which has been held in abeyance can be released for operational use in purchasing a permanent "feature" for the cemetery.
- 2. Volunteers Agreed not to repeat the idea of evening sessions but try leafletting in the local neighbourhood and putting notices in the cemetery grounds and with funeral directors
- 3. TDC endeavour to get their meadow cut done earlier in the year with definite commitment for a second cut in the autumn.

AOB - Neil Howell

- 1. Agreed to continue running the Teignmouth Old Cemetery Trust (Charity) in readiness for being able to renew efforts with TDC in renovating the buildings. This will also require a review of the previous business plan for continued viability.
- 2. Thanks to everyone who has contributed to the work of FOTC in the last year.
